

## Bibliographies – MLA Style

### Proper order of the most basic details:

Author Last, First.

“Title of Article or Chapter.”

*If one chapter is all you used, you need this part. If you jumped around the whole book, skip this part and the page numbers.*

*Title of Book.*

Place:

*Only add the state if the city is unfamiliar to most people.*

Publisher,

Year.

page number(s).

*Never say “page.” Just list the number/page range.*

*Name of the Website.*

*Only use the blue items as available when the source that you used came from the internet.*

*Publisher of the Website.*

Medium of publication.

*Print, Web, Film, DVD, CD, etc.*

*Date of Access.*

*Date Month Year.*

*<URL>.*

### Very Picky Punctuation:

*Set your LINE SPACING to 2.0. Do not double space for your computer.*

*Set your INDENTING to HANGING. Let the end of your entry WRAP down to the next line whenever it is ready. Do not force it.*

Full Advanced Bibliography Recipe:

Author Last, First. “Title of Article/Chapter.” *Title of Book*. Ed. First Last. Vol. #. Name

of Series. Place: Publisher, year. page number(s). Medium.
